# Aotearoa/New Zealand

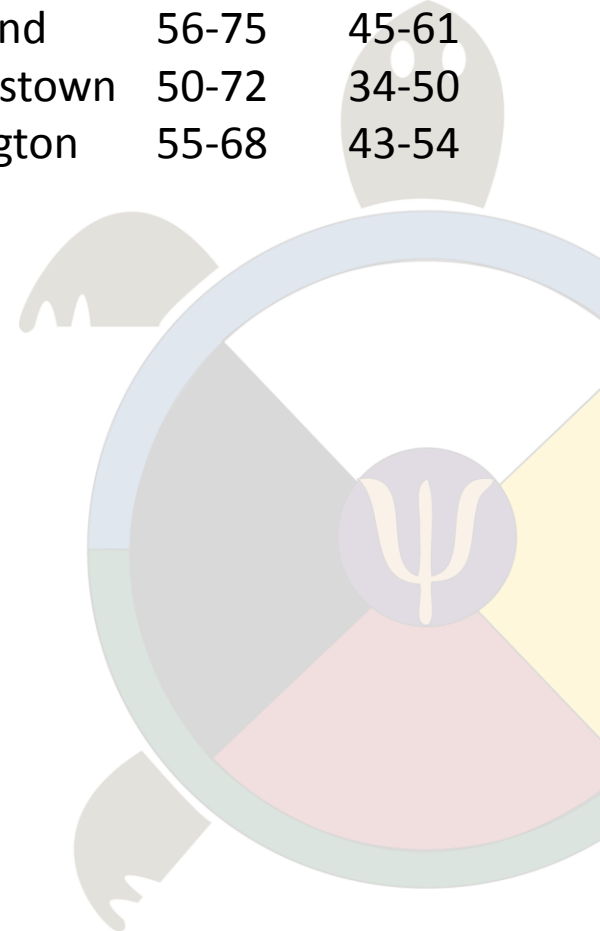


Almost straight south of Hawaii
